Description	<p>Type: Gallery Range</p> <p>Danger area: Full Danger Area (FDA)</p> <p>Location (What3words): Chip.pans.slower</p> <p>Distance: 7m - 100m</p> <p>Targets:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 20 turning targets (4x banks of 5) (7m – 100m) • Moving target (100m) <p>Additional notes: There is open access to other ranges within the BSR complex (see coordinating instructions below)</p>
FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION	
Permitted firearms and ammunition including ME & MV	<p>Type: Rifles; gallery rifles and pistols by special arrangement only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maximum Muzzle Velocity: 1000 m/s (3280 ft/s) • Maximum Muzzle Energy: 4500 J (3319 ft/lb) • HME Permitted: 4500J – 7000J HME procedures apply (Static targetry only) <p>Type: Shotguns</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Solid slug only up to a maximum of 10 bore with prior approval of the BSR manager • Not permitted for use on the moving target <p>Not Permitted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • .22-250 • .220 Swift • No muzzle brakes to be used inside the hut at 100m • Muzzle Loading/Black Powder firearms are not to be discharged on any electronic scoring targets • No HME to be discharged at the Moving Targetry

Statics ii. Running Boar iii. 50 Yard Zero b. Melville c. Stickle-down d. Pirbright 2. Access: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. All movement forward of the Running Deer Range firing point requires the following ranges to have ceased fire, and must be coordinated by the BSR manager or delegate: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Running Deer ii. Statics

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> iii. Running Boar- iv. 50 Yard Zeroing b. When there are personnel forward of the firing points, the red flag system is to be followed under the direction of the BSR Manager or delegate c. When shooting is conducted from the turning target firing points, the BSR Manager is to ensure demarcation lines are set up between Running Deer and Statics range to ensure safe access/egress <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Another shooter is permitted to dry fire from the alternate lane for the moving target 4. Range infrastructure is not to be used as targetry or to zero/check zero firearms 5. A Suitably Qualified Experience Person (SQEP) is to be appointed as the responsible RO when shooting 6. Vehicles are not permitted on the range floor without prior permission from the BSR manager
<p>Firing positions</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 7. Positions permitted Turning Targets FP's (prior permission must be obtained): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Benched b. Standing c. Kneeling d. Sitting 8. Positions permitted from the Deer Hut: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Standing 9. Permission to fire from any other position (such as obstacles) is to be approved by the BSR manager. Obstacles are to be provided or approved by BSR. 10. On the Turning Target FP's changes of position are permitted within any detail or practice outside competition providing all firers follow the same sequence, and in competition in accordance with the conditions
<p>Targetry</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 11. MAX TCH: 1.5m 12. Only targets from the BSR approved set may be used 13. Targets are to be used in the frames or holders provided and are to be engaged only from the recognised firing points and/or appropriate shooting station or peg. Any deviation from this is to be notified and approved by the NSC Head of Operations. 14. Moving Target is to be engaged from a maximum of 100m. Any reduction in the engagement distance must be requested and approved by the BSR Manager. 15. Falling Plates or other hard targets may not be engaged within Running Deer Range
